
THE BLACK YOUTH & MASS **INCARCERATION** ALACHUA COUNTY, **FLORIDA**

Recent trends show the overall juvenille incarceration rate has steadaily declined, by 50% between 2000-2015. However, studies depict the continuous and increased rate of arrest within the Black youth population.

Black students are 5.2 times more likely to be suspended than White students

Over-Policing in Black Communties

"East Gainesville is where the police make the majority of drug busts"



75% of misdemeanor arrests for marijuana in 2014-2015 were Black

College-aged Black youths living off-campus are <u>9 TIMES</u> more likely to be arrested for drugs than their white UF peers
