

Voting is a Right... Right?



2021

Georgia's General Assembly passed legislation limiting the right to vote for millions of people.



Ballot box locations have been limited by population to just

1 for every 100,000

This means that the number of ballot boxes in metro Atlanta is now just

23



Access to ballot boxes has also been **Restricted** by requiring that they be **inside** of government buildings.



Legislation makes it

illegal

to pass out **food** or **water** within 25 feet of voters in line or 150 feet of a polling location.



Early Voting

and absentee ballot requesting times have been limited.



57%

of felony convictions are for non-violent crimes.



265,000

individuals are currently restricted from voting due to felony convictions.



Absentee Ballots require that you submit a copy of a state-issued driver's license or ID card, and any mistake on the ballot may cause your vote to be voided.

Know Your Rights, Protect What's Right.

The right to participate in government is a fundamental human right. The General Assembly's restrictions on voting locations and times, and restrictions on how Georgians can vote, all work to make it harder for you to enjoy the right to vote.
